The score is written for violin in 4/4 time, with a tempo marking of *a tempo* and a quarter note equal to 72 (♩ = 72). The piece begins with a *freely* marking. The seventh system (measures 40-43) features a change to 3/4 and back to 4/4, with dynamics from *p* to *mf*. The eighth system (measures 44-48) includes a change to 3/4 and back to 4/4, with dynamics from *p* to *f*. The score includes various articulations such as slurs, accents, and dynamic hairpins, as well as fingerings (3, 6) and a triplet of sixteenth notes.
